7. Area School Districts
  - a. [PRESENTATION: Digital Learners. Digital Citizens.](#) Providing life skills and awareness about web content.
    - i. Top 3 reasons kids go online: 1) Extend real life relationships 2) To keep learning 3) Geeking out, to dig deeply into a subject matter.
    - ii. Today's elementary aged youth are considered Digital Natives, those who have not experienced life without the high speed internet.
    - iii. Statistics: 33% of online teen share their own creations online; over 50% of teens created content for the web from current web content; 6 of 10 teen receive all their news from online sources; 33% of 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> graders self-reported that they used computers unsupervised at home; 20% of 2<sup>nd</sup>- 3<sup>rd</sup> graders reported that someone had been mean to them online; IN 2007, 4

of 10 teens reported being hurt or embarrassed by other teens (cyberbullying).

- iv. Educational Technology teaches that web content is public & permanent and what impacts that has on ones future, especially on social networking sites. Also teaches about the use, reuse, and reproduction of online information – in relation to copyrights and plagiarism.
- v. Glossary: Flaming – an online fight; Exclusion – conspiring to exclude a person from online networks; Harassment & Denigration happens on websites and through text flooding; Impersonation is a web account created under false pretences to misrepresent an actual person.
- vi. How to help kids deal with cyber bullying: Change info; block bully; refuse to pass messages; exclude bully.
- vii. What can adults do to help kids navigate technology safely: Listen & ask questions, ask to see profile pages...tomorrow, its not an invasion of privacy if it's a public site, see the risk and the good in every situation, save digital evidence not just printouts.
