## 2. Program – Domester Violence Awareness Month

- a. Representatives from Life Span in Des Plaines presented information on domestic violence.
- b. They help victims and their children by providing counseling and legal services.
- c. Legal services provided by Life Span include orders of protection, no contact orders, U-Visas and VAWAs.
- d. The typical cycle of violence includes tensions building, an incident, reconciliation and then calm.
- e. Types of violence include: physical, emotional and sexual.

- f. When suspecting domestic violence discuss in a safe place, avoid blaming and work on safety planning.
- g. The national average for victims is 7-12 attempts before successfully leaving abuser.
